Safety Report

Greetings Tri City Gun Club Members,

Merry Christmas: Merry Christmas to all TCGC Members and their families.

Farewell Note: This will be my last Safety Corner given I am stepping down at the end of this year. I want to thank each of you for your many years of support. I have enjoyed my tenure and serving you and Tri-City Gun Club. I would ask that you extend this same level of support to the new Chief Range Safety Officer, Hazen Bazinet, who will come board on January 1st, 2022. I will continue to support the club as needed in the future and hope to see you there.

Swap Meet: The Swap meet is scheduled for December 3rd in the Goldsby Community Center. If you are bringing a firearm, it must be unloaded and clear with the action open and Open Chamber Indicator placed in the chamber or in a case. It will be inspected at the door to make sure it is clear, and the action will be secured using a zip tie or some other means to ensure it will not function. If you are going to sell firearms and ammunition, please make sure they are placed on different ends of your table. You might also consider using a "Record of Firearms Transfer Between Unlicensed Persons" form that will be available at the door. We may also have a Club Member who is an FFL available to assist.

Eye and Ear Protection for Children: It pleases me to see parents and grandparents bring children to the range to shoot their new 22 rifles. To enhance this experience, I thought I would share with you that you can get age-appropriate eye and hearing protection \ earmuffs which are much easier for children to use than standard safety glasses and ear plugs. Children's eye and ear protection are available locally via Academy, Bass Pro Shop and Cabela's as well as on online via Midway, Amazon and many other local or online retailers. Do your research to find the best the best protection for your child or young person. The higher the Noise Reduction Rating (NRR) the, more protection is provided.

Guest Waivers: Remember guest waivers are to be completed once for each calendar year. New guest waivers will be required on or after January 1st, 2022.

If you have any questions, please give me a call, or send me a note.

Be safe and shoot straight, make sure your bullets impact the lower 2/3rds of the Backstop.

White Targets for Monday Night Trap

TCGC did not, does not, nor will ever purchase black rimmed targets for skeet/trap. If they have been loaded into the machines and you are unable to see them when shooting, then please feel free to unload them carefully and reload with all orange.

CLEAN-UP IS A MUST

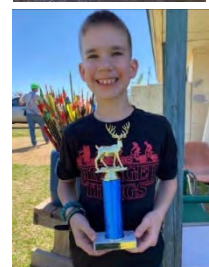
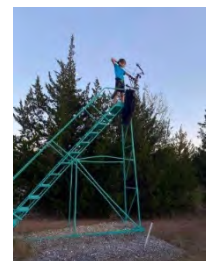

6. Mike Whitaker would like to recognize 3 shooters, Robert, Russ and Rick. They come out and do the work, they give the time and effort. Mike can help you pick out a gun to buy.
7. Next week we will be printing badges and they will be mailed out.
8. This meeting was the last chance to be added to the ballot for officer nominations.
9. There are over 150 open positions for new members.
10. Hazen Bazinet introduced himself. He is running for Chief Range Safety Officer. "Be deliberate" is Hazen's catch phrase. "He has a good temperament," said Ken Anderson.
11. The Member at Large reported that renewal went great this year!
12. The Scheduler reported that we would like to open new memberships mid-November or December.
13. There are 170 Life Members.
14. Next week, the calendar will be completely updated for the next year.
15. The December regular club meeting will be held at 7:00 at the Goldsby Community Center. We have the building the entire day. A swap meet will be held the day of the meeting at the same location. It will be held all day, with setup starting at 9:00 a.m. There will be ammo!! More details TBD. Raffles, etc. Please sign up so Tara will know how many tables we need.
16. OK2A was discussed, and OK2A representatives will be joining us for the next meeting.
17. As of right now, from a financial standpoint, the budget has been published, we will vote on it next month. The 990 forms have been submitted. The accountant says we should have everything next month.

Executive Meeting Minutes- November 18, 2021

1. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.
2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
3. Renewals and new member sign up were discussed. Very few people were late to renew. When we do the new member training, we would like to do the range tour first.
4. There was a brief discussion about automation. A few edge case errors were identified to be corrected for next year.
5. A swap meet is scheduled for December 3rd to be held all day at the Goldsby Community Center. There is some concern with running it all day. Mark will be there all day. Having a member with an FFL at the meet was suggested. Setup will be at 9:00 a.m.
6. Guest speakers at club meetings were discussed. It was noted that the club must remain apolitical. More regular guest speakers would add more value to the membership meetings.
7. 100-yard target placement and targets being moved was raised as a concern. Pinned targets at the 100 yard and 150-yard line would be helpful.

8. The election of the CRSO was discussed. Last time we had unopposed elections; we went through various steps that may have been more than was necessary. We can use a simple google form or other online voting tool to affirm the votes. The budget can be voted for at the same time.
9. White clay targets were discussed. The shotgun director will contact the supplier. We are expecting a price increase. We will be able to get targets next year.
10. CSRO transition was discussed. Keys, codes, combinations, camera access, alarms, etc. will be updated.
11. Ken will still be available to assist with running and staffing events. Hw will need some amount of access to Wild Apricot.
12. Sportsfest is planned for the first Saturday in April. A scout troop is interested in camping out over sportsfest. That is okay, but scouts cannot participate in sportsfest as scouts, because scouts cannot use handguns.
13. Hunter Education needs to be added to the calendar ASAP, so that it can be added to the hunting regulations.
14. A wintertime RSO class would be nice. Ken may not be able to teach it. Jerry VanBebber, Eric Bauman, or other CRSOs could teach it.
15. OEC fiber was down briefly and is now back up.
16. It was noted that the club tracks no information regarding any members firearms or other property, members attendance to meetings, members range activity, or anything else other than very basic membership data in accordance with the club's privacy policy.
17. 990s (not for profit documentation) have been submitted in a timely manner.
18. A few members thanked the board for the really great renewal process.
19. Some members did not receive their postcard renewal reminders.
20. SOPs for transition of match or discipline directors would be very helpful.
21. Financials are up to date and there is money in the bank.
22. Badge updates were discussed.
23. The gate and door combination will change on the afternoon of the 31st. A reminder will be put into the Hangfire for December and January.
24. Next year's calendar is being updated. It will look a little different. Work hours will be set up for logging.
25. The tractor will be returning from servicing tomorrow. We'd like to get a block heater.
26. The proposed bylaw change was discussed. Changing member statuses would still leave 66 associate member openings.
27. The meeting was adjourned at 8:27 p.m.

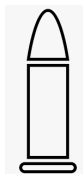
