Safety Report

Greetings Tri City Gun Club Members,

Chief Range Safety Officer: I will be stepping down as the Chief Range Safety Officer (CRSO) at the end of my current term, December 31st, 2021. If you are interested in running for the CRSO position in the November election, you can review the position requirements in the TCGC By-Laws. I would

also be happy to visit with you about the position as defined in the by-laws and the many other things I do.

Long Range Improvements, 200-Yard Target and Gongs: We have recently completed some major improvements on the Long Range to increase the backstop area behind the 200-yard targets and gongs. We removed three feet of dirt from the ledge between firing points 9 and 12. This improvement increased the backstop area by three feet, giving twenty feet of backstop behind the targets as recommended by the NRA Range Source Book. This improvement resulted in the following changes:

1. 200-yard paper target is at firing point 9.
2. 200-yard gongs are at firing points 10 and 11.
3. 150-yard gongs are at firing points 12 and 15.

Members are asked to not occupy these shooting stations unless they are engaging these targets. Also do not crossfire across the range to engage these targets.

We also created a road to access the ledge and put down 5000 square feet of sod. The sod has turned green and has improved our erosion control.

Upcoming Events: As we move forward with Covid19, we are looking to the future and scheduling events. The following is a quick list of events on the horizon:

- Family Day and Swap Meet, June 19th
- Youth Hunter Education Challenge, August 7th
- Oklahoma Hunter Education Clinic, September 18th
- Oklahoma Wildlife Expo at the Lazy E Arena, September 24th to 26th, supporting the ODWC's Shotgun Training and Education Program.
- Boy Scout Camp and Shoot, October 2nd.

Many of these events require club member volunteers as helpers, coaches, RSOs, Range

Masters etc. They are an excellent opportunity to complete 2021 Workhours. Look for additional information in future editions of the Hangfire.

NOTICE on Target Placement & Cost of Materials Pistol & Short Rifle Range

One Target Centered

Never attach paper targets over or near the wooden sides of the target stands. One Target Centered. The



rising cost of materials to build these stands (\$20 per stand) is going to be an issue as the shooters continue to shoot and destroy the frames of the targets we supply. I have had several reports and have witnessed shooters putting multiple targets on one frame. Again, One Target, One Frame. We can/will monitor these shooting lanes. Violators could be charged for target replacement.

Pistol and Short Rifle range paper targets need to be placed in the center of the white plastic. Centered from top to bottom based on your point of aim. For example, if you are a 6'2 standing shooter you would not place your target at the lower half of the target board. Make sure your bullet path is parallel to the ground and impacting the backstop. If shooting from the table, you may need to bring your own cardboard to attach to stand to maintain bullet parallel to ground rule.

General Meeting Minutes – May 7, 2021

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mark Eriksen. The meeting was held in person at the TCGC pavilion and virtually via Google Meet.
2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
3. The Chief Range Safety Office reported that the wall between the pistol and short rifle range is complete. The handicap parking spaces are open. 5,000 square feet of sod were added to the long range. Call or text Ken with any questions or concerns.
4. The Vice President reported that the June 7th Friends of the NRA Banquet tickets are \$40 each or \$70 for a pair.
5. The Secretary reminded associate members that after 3 years of associate membership a member may request to be promoted to regular membership with voting privileges.
6. New memberships will open up in June for half year memberships, there are 175 openings.
7. The Treasurer reported that everything with the club is going well. The maintenance director changes will not affect the budget.
8. The Scheduler demonstrated a new target frame for the rifle and pistol ranges. There will be samples on the ranges soon. Check out the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife- Lexington shooting range online for examples; <https://www.wildlifedepartment.com/wildlife-management-areas/shooting-ranges>.
9. The June workday will be on a Friday evening. Dinner will be provided.
10. June 19th is Father's Day family day. There will be a swap meet and lunch. All the shotgun fields will be open.
11. The Member at Large reported no recent complaints or negative comments to report!
12. The President reported that Bill has officially retired, Randy and Tara Nelson will take over the maintenance position.
13. Kevin Riley asked for volunteers for Camp and Shoot.
14. Simm Rudnick reported finding dirt bike tracks on the archery practice range berm and on the field range. He asked for no more dirt bikes on the berms. To help illustrate the danger of this sort of improper use, Simm showed several items recovered from the berm just moments before, including scrap metal and broadhead arrow tips.
15. Scott Steno reported that he has opened a firearms store.
16. Military Bolt Action Battle Rifle (MBABR) is coming up. Members were encouraged to participate.
17. The drawing was conducted.
18. The meeting was adjourned at 7:32 p.m.

Executive Meeting Minutes – May 20, 2021

1. The meeting was called to order at 6:30.
2. The President and Scheduler were not in attendance.
3. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
4. The Member at Large discussed a membership renewal for a member who had been sick during renewals and had provided notice. We are working with him.
5. The Secretary reported that we have numerous openings and have members that are interested in upgrades. The intent is to open the application in the first part of June. There was some discussion of session dates and planning. The merits of online renewal sessions were noted and are appreciated. However, there will need to be some on-range content.
6. Apparel was briefly discussed. It fell through in the past. However, it may be time to resurrect this idea.
7. The Treasurer Office reported that he is running behind on a lot of things and does not plan to run as the treasurer again. He has moved a lot of the work and record keeping online, so that things are easier. He wants to find a successor as soon as possible in order to begin training them.
8. Pay for the two maintenance contractors was discussed. Pay for April will be disbursed. It was noted that the maintenance tasks have been divided into two separate positions. The amount budgeted and paid will remain the same but is divided between the two contractors.
9. The Chief Range Safety Office reported that it is time to update the insurance. An increase of 10% for property value is being proposed to cover increases in costs. The value of facilities was discussed. A 3-5% increase for the buildings and no increase for the conexas was preferred for the time being. Further increases can always be done later. We would like to have an assessment completed and lay the groundwork for proceduralizing this process, so that others can take over in the future. Insurance coverage in general was discussed. It was noted that a previous review of the club's insurance through the NRA was inadequate.
10. Purchasing a trailer was discussed. It was noted that the club is currently dependent upon people donating the use of their trailer. Ken will look at trailers.
11. Woody will get the alarm call list reviewed and updated.
12. Ken is going to look into different open chamber indicators. The ones we have been using for shotgun are no longer available.
13. When shooting at the 200-yard berm, the 100 is getting clipped while using some firing lanes. The berm will be shaved down some.
14. Family day was discussed. Jamie will place instructions in the Hangfire.
15. Target placement was discussed.
16. We will need to find a nominating committee.
17. The meeting was adjourned at 7:35 pm.

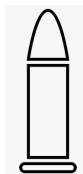
