Safety Report

Hello everyone; hope you have been able to get out to range during the nice warm "Spring Breaks" that we have had between cold snaps since New Year ;)

New members: We conducted two orientation sessions for new members in January. I spoke with a great bunch of new members who you'll be seeing out on range. Again, when you see new members (indicated by portrait badges), take a few minutes to say hello, answer any questions. And for new members, don't hesitate to ask if not sure about anything.

Range Safety Officers: By the time you read this Ken will have run first course for 7 new RSOs, with another course scheduled in Feb. As I mentioned in last Hangfire with details, I am maintaining a wait list for future courses, so if you are interested in certification, please let me know (email below).

Short Range: A few reminders from the rules for this range. Do not move target stands from pistol range – place target sticks into receivers at designated 25-, 50-, and 75-yard lines. Rifles only

on this range – no shotguns, no pistols (with exceptions for organized events).

Brass: I had mentioned this at the January General Meeting, but thought I'd delay just a bit to also mention here for anyone who might want to get brass. I'll be cleaning brass from Stat House to scrap. Members can buy brass at \$1 per pound. A scale and brass sorters are available at table in Stat House.

As always shoot straight, place your targets at a height so that bullets impact the lower 2/3rds of the backstop, and place targets centered so you don't hit the sticks. Use and be aware of the red lights. Always be deliberate in your actions with firearms.

2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
3. Don Spencer, President of OK2A, spoke. He updated about new gun laws, stating, "OK2A is taking the stupid out of gun control laws." He encouraged members to get involved, know who our state representatives are and to keep a working relationship with them. OAEC is an app that will tell you who your Oklahoma legislator is. OK2A has a grading system for legislators and their standpoint on gun rights. If our legislators don't do what we want, we can vote them out. There was discussion about the 10th amendment. Insurance policies were discussed, and Don recommended US Law Shield. US Law Shield is \$12 per month. Join at OK2A.org. Membership is \$25.

12. We are trying to set up 3 vintage battle rifle matches this year.

15. We need volunteers for the youth events this year.
16. Hazen Bazinet thanked Ken Anderson for his help with the transition and his notes.
17. Don't forget to sign the new guest waivers for this year.
18. Orientations for new members will be the next two Sundays.
19. If you see a new member, help them out.
20. There will be some courses held for RSOs. Ken Anderson will be doing the training. Six per class, two classes are full and five are on the waiting list. He would like to see some younger members get this training as well.
21. Bullets need to hit the berm, if you see a problem, please say something.

Executive Meeting Minutes - January 20, 2022

1. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.
2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
3. Discussed upcoming youth events. Scheduling of events was a topic of interest. Tomahawk could be a good alternate event for Boy Scouts who can't shoot handguns. COVID-19 protocols were discussed. Staff will eat at the ranges. Attendees will spread out, so that they can distance. EMS will be provided by the club. The Medieval Fair may be a conflict. Kavan has already visited with Goldey about providing food.
4. Ken will be hosting RSO classes. Details were established.
5. The event coordinator needs to be set up on the TCGC Board email distribution list.

6. CRSO transition details were discussed.
7. A run-&-gun event will be held in Ardmore. We will post it in the Hangfire.
8. Assistance with member events was discussed.
9. Bob Touchstone passed away.
10. We held off on submitting grants. Archery asked for equipment. Funds may be made available from raffle and swap meet proceeds.
11. New membership has closed. We have 57 new members who completed orientation. The club is full (if spouses are counted). There are a few more people that need orientations.
12. NRA Gold Medal application is due.
13. The board would like to discuss the 100% NRA membership requirement in the future but would like to formally add it to the agenda, so that interested members can provide input.
14. A proposed bylaw change needs to be brought before the membership, so that it can be voted upon.
15. Guests driving their own vehicle onto the range cannot be given the gate code. Their sponsoring member needs to let them in.
16. McClain County Sheriff's Office is stepping up its patrolling in our area.
17. Target selection and placement, as well as use of the correct range for the firearm being used were discussed. Very specifically, target stands are not to be moved from range to range; only the allowed firearm and ammo types may be used on each range; there are **no** conditions in which the destruction of club property is acceptable.
18. Members are not to block the gate for any reason. Blocking the gate is dangerous, increases the risk of gate malfunctions, and doesn't help anything. Stopping will NOT delay the prevent another driver from entering the club behind you. If you are concerned about someone entering the club, politely ask to see their badge, if they are not displaying it.
19. Women on Target is still under consideration. Tara is not getting much response from the NRA. She noted that voicemail boxes are not set up at NRA. If we cannot get NRA support, we will hold our own event.
20. OEC will be doing work soon.
21. Turn in Goldsby community center keys at the bill pay slot if you happen to end up with one after a meeting.
22. Armbands and vests for events were discussed.
23. Three Vintage Battle Rifle events are planned.
24. Please do not share prospective information regarding future projects that have not been formally planned and discussed with the membership. Doing so creates rumors, misinformation, and unreasonable expectations.
25. Finding additional members for the finance committee was discussed.
26. Rules and regulations for SDA classes was discussed. SDA instructors must furnish the club with proof of insurance and instructor credentials. SDA instructors must abide by club rules, including having sufficient RSO coverage. There was considerable discussion on this topic with no resolution. Further discussion will be necessary, but we would like to get a coherent policy in place.
27. The meeting was adjourned at 8:24 p.m.

Proposed ByLaw change:

Revise treatment of Family & Complementary Memberships

Purpose:

General objective: Long time members who joined the club as spouses or complimentary members have expressed interest in promotion to regular membership, so that they may vote and so that they may take on board duties. There is currently no reasonable path to regular membership for these members, without effectively starting over as new members. This bylaw change works to correct that deficiency.

Spouse members: Spouse members are currently included in the bylaws with children, under family membership. As currently written, the club bylaws only allow spouses priority when upgrading to associate membership as memberships become available. This benefit appears to be aimed at bypassing a membership waiting list that does not exist. As over the previous 13 years the club has never been full, there is no apparent benefit to priority. This fails to recognize the years of membership and contributions of spouse members. Although discounted dues have traditionally been applied, spouse members are not addressed by the bylaws in regard to membership dues or the initiation fee.

To address these concerns, it is proposed to treat spouse members as other adult members are treated and include them among associate and/or regular members, as appropriate. To facilitate this change, the spouse membership will be converted to a spouse discount, to be applied to whatever regular or associate membership dues the spouse may owe.

Complementary members: As the bylaws are currently written, complementary members are treated as associate members. Complementary members are required to abide by all of the standards that associate members are held to, with the exception of paying dues. The bylaws, as currently written, do not address the allowability of a discount or waiver of the initiation fee. Although complementary members may apply their time as associate members toward promotion to regular membership, the bylaws do not have a means for complementary members to be treated as anything other than associate members. Nor do the bylaws include the means for a regular member to be granted a complimentary membership, without sacrificing their regular member status. This limits the ability for complimentary members to take a more active role in the club and limits incentive for large donations of time and effort by regular members.

To address the concerns, it is proposed to include complementary members among associate and/or regular members, as appropriate. To facilitate this change, the complementary membership will be converted to a complementary discount, to be applied to whatever initiation fees or regular or associate membership dues the member may owe.

Actions:

1. Discontinue use of Complimentary membership type.
2. Discontinue use of Family membership type.
3. Replace Family Membership type with Youth membership type.
 - 3.1. **Note:** Youth will continue to have preference for promotion to associate.
4. Add an annual discount for complementary members.
5. Add an annual discount for spouse members.

Section 3 .011: TYPES OF MEMBERSHIP: Membership shall consist of REGULAR MEMBERS, ASSOCIATE MEMBERS, FAMILY MEMBERS, LIFE MEMBERS, and COMPLIMENTARY MEMBERS; the Membership shall not exceed One-Thousand One Hundred (1100) Regular and Associate members; all other Memberships are not to be counted as part of the One-Thousand One Hundred (11 00) limit for Tri-City Gun Club.

Section 3.04: FAMILY MEMBERSHIP. Family Membership may be granted a member's spouse and children up to 21 years of age. Family members shall have full use of the range facilities and can participate in scheduled matches, are not required, but are encouraged to attend regularly scheduled monthly meetings and participate in other TCGC activities. Family Memberships are not eligible to vote or hold office. Family members under the age of 21 must be accompanied by an adult Member and are required to adhere to all club rules and regulations. Types of Family Memberships include: Spouse and Junior. Spouse and Junior Members shall have priority to upgrade their membership to Associate as memberships become available.

Section 3.06: COMPLIMENTARY MEMBERSHIP. The Board may grant a Complimentary Membership by vote of same as deemed appropriate to a deserving individual. The Complimentary Membership shall lapse at the end of the current membership year, unless re-granted for an additional year by the Board. Complimentary members shall have the same privileges as an Associate Member, and be exempt from dues. Complimentary Members must be members of the National Rifle Association, must attend an Annual Range & Safety Orientation, and are required to abide by all TCGC Rules and Regulations. Complimentary Memberships are not counted as part of the TCGC Membership Limit

Complimentary Members must be members of the National Rifle Association, must attend an Annual Range & Safety Orientation, and are required to abide by all TCGC Rules and Regulations. Complimentary Memberships are not counted as part of the TCGC Membership Limit~~

New: Section 4.07 SPOUSE MEMBERSHIP DISCOUNT: The spouse of a current member will be granted a Spouse Membership Discount of part of the established annual dues. The amount

of dues granted will be established by the Board and published. Only one Spouse Membership Discount shall be granted per legal union of a couple as spouses.

New: Section 4.08 COMPLIMENTARY MEMBERSHIP DISCOUNT: The Board may as deemed appropriate by vote of same grant a Complimentary Membership Discount of part or all of the established initiation fees and annual dues to a deserving individual. The Complimentary Membership Discount shall lapse at the end of the current membership year, unless re-granted for an additional year by the Board.
