Hello everyone; chilly mornings lead to nice warm afternoons on the range ©

New members: I conducted a few make-up sessions for new members in February. One more reminder - when you see new members (indicated by portrait badges), take a few minutes to say hello and answer any questions. For new members, don't hesitate to ask if not sure about anything.

Range Safety Officers: Congratulations and thanks to six new RSOs from course that Ken ran in January. By the time you read this he will have run a second course for eight more RSOs. Third course TBD, probably in May. Again, I am maintaining a wait list for future courses so if you are interested in certification and wish to help the club for events, please let me know.

Commercial Use of Ranges by Members: To answer member questions, and after review with Board, the following paragraph will be inserted into administrative section of Range Rules. "TCGC facilities are for use by members and guests only. Members always have priority over commercial activities on the ranges. Members who wish to use the range for commercial activities of any type are required to: 1) request approval through CRSO, and 2) provide a certificate of liability coverage for \$1 million dollars that names TCGC as an additional insured. The club does not endorse any particular commercial enterprise. Commercial enterprises may advertise in the Hangfire."

As always shoot straight, place targets at a height so that bullets impact the lower 2/3rds of

the backstop, and place targets centered so you don't hit the sticks. Use and be aware of the red lights. Always be deliberate in your actions with firearms.

This message applies to the clean-up of the counters, handles, sink, toilet, or any other surfaces you may have contaminated.

All match directors are to clean up after their events. Trash cans downrange on the long-range must be emptied after Practical Pistol and 3-Gun.

NOTICE!! 10MPH or less Please. Volunteer workers, shooters (especially archery), and the vehicle behind you don't want a huge cloud of dust in their face or settling on their firearms and vehicles. Please slow down to 10MPH or less. Observe the cloud of dust behind you.

Do not stop at the gate when entering the club. If you stop and wait for the gate to close, when you proceed, you will trigger gate to reopen. Do not stop and block a car from following you in. Wait to identify membership after parking on range.

<u>General Meeting Minutes – February 4, 2022</u>

Meeting was cancelled. No Minutes Available

Executive Meeting Minutes-February 17, 2022

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.
- 2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
- 3. Tractor is back from John Deere.
- 4. Control of goat's heads and other stickers is being planned and will be done as soon as possible. We have a good supply of chemicals. Chemical purchases will be limited this year. No spoilage is anticipated, but chemical supplies will be assessed, and damaged containers will be covered.
- 5. A member has offered to smoke meat for the club during events, meetings, etc. We will take him up on it.
- 6. We have three versions of the Sportsfest flier. It will be widely distributed.
- 7. We are expecting a good turnout for Sportsfest.
- 8. A female oriented shooting event is in the works. Resources and staff needs are being assessed. More info to come.
- 9. Banking and investment options are being collected for review by the finance committee.

- 10. Funding for range improvements was discussed. Determining quarterly spending expectations will help to plan investment of club funds that are otherwise idle and only drawing very low interest rates.
- 11. There was discussion regarding electronic records and the club's record retention policy. The club has records that can be eliminated. Board members need to review what records they have, if those records are compliant with the record retention policy, and that those records are digitized. Online records in Wild Apricot will be purged following the end of the membership year.
- 12. Several members have asked the board to review the requirement to be a member of the NRA and the value of NRA affiliation. Funding received from NRA vs funds and resources expended for NRA purposes were discussed. Several additional things must be considered. Member rebates not only save the members some money, but also provide some funding to the club. In the past, the club relied on the NRA for insurance. However, the club no longer uses the NRA insurance, because it was insufficient. That insurance is for the most part no longer offered. Changing the club's NRA affiliation or membership requirement would necessitate a bylaw change. Eliminating the NRA requirement would save the club a considerable amount of time and money expended on NRA membership verification. RSO verification is another variable to be considered. Regardless of how we do it, we will need to maintain a way to verify the credentials of RSOs. There is online credential verification, and it is easy to use. The primary considerations in the end are that the NRA has historically funded the club with between six and eight thousand annually, but in recent years this funding has been reduced. The club not maintaining its Gold Club status would not be detrimental to the club financially and would be in the interest of the club in many ways. Should the club move away from mandating NRA membership, although the club would not mandate membership in other organizations, the club would strongly encourage such membership.
- 13. A youth with a parent attending youth shotgun arrived with a shotgun that had a round in the tube. The issue was discovered when youth was asked to insert a chamber flag. There was some discussion regarding how to better proceduralized these checks for non-member shooters during events.
- 14. A guest cut themselves on the pistol range. The injury itself was assumed to be inconsequential as no incident report was received, but there were concerns regarding cleanup of blood at the shooting bench, on the ground, and in the bathroom. Cleanup in this case is not only a health and safety issue, but also a question of consideration for other members. Members are encouraged to carry first-aid kits. Unless a member is incapacitated, they are expected to be responsible for cleaning up after themselves and their guests. This will be mentioned in the maintenance article.
- 15. TCGC facilities are for members and guests only. Members always have priority over commercial activities on the ranges. The club does not endorse any particular commercial enterprise. Commercial enterprises may advertise in the Hangfire. Members who use the range for commercial activities of any type are required to provide a certificate of liability coverage for \$1 million dollars that names TCGC as an additional insured.
- 1. SDA instructors can be removed from the membership database as a membership type.
- 2. Hangfire advertisements for commercial purposes are charged according to the existing fee schedule.
- 3. The forum will be eliminated.
- 4. Insurance is done.
- 5. Be sure to coordinate any scheduled use of the Stat house with the Scheduler.
- 6. The RV needs to be removed from the range.
- 7. Sportsfest was discussed. We will use lead wipes again. Portable toilets have been arranged. Cleaning supplies are already available on the range. We have ammo ready to go. It has been asked that event items be put back where they belong.
- 8. The meeting was adjourned at 10:00 p.m.


