

\*\*Long Range Targets\*\* Please do not move the large target boards (100yrd) on the long range. They have been staked.

Telephone poles cut offs were placed at the pistol range for holding stands in high winds.

Do not stop at the gate when entering the club. If you stop and wait for the gate to close, when you proceed, you will trigger gate to reopen. Do not stop and block a car from following you in. Wait to identify membership after parking on range.

#### Safety Report

It seems that Spring may be here to stay so I hope you are able to get out and <u>safely</u> enjoy your range.

RSOs for Trail Life Youth Shotgun: As I had mentioned in March General Meeting, we need RSOs to support a shotgun event on informal range Saturday May 14. The boys will be earning Merit Badges, similar to Scout Badges. Please contact me if you can help.

First Aid Training: I've been thinking that has been too long since I updated my training, so I intend to do so with "Stop the Bleed". I encourage members to consider doing the same. I'm hoping we can setup a course for interested members in the Stat House, watch for an announcement on that. If you are already certified in first aid, please tell Match Directors when at matches. I've also been researching the latest belt carried tourniquets, sharing one thing I've learned for any members who may be shopping – be aware of cheap counterfeits that are useless when needed.

<u>Waivers</u>: A reminder that members must complete a waiver with their guests for any type of shooting on any ranges.

<u>Brass</u>: As you read this, first quarter of 22 is ending, so I'll be collecting brass from ranges to buckets in Stat House. A reminder that members



can buy for \$1 per pound, sorters and scale are available on the table. Please cleanup after your sorting.

As always shoot straight, place targets at a height so that bullets impact the lower 2/3rds of the backstop, and place targets centered so you don't hit the sticks. Use and be aware of the red lights. Always be deliberate in your actions with firearms.

Spring is here and the Military Bolt Action Benchrest (MBABR) season is well under way. This match is held the second Saturday of each month and we invite everyone out to learn more about the event and participate. In general, any World War I - World War II military bolt action battle rifle in original, as-issued configuration is eligible. The 100-yard course of fire is sighters plus two 10-shot targets for group size and three 10-shot targets for score.

The gate opens at 8:00 AM, first relay begins at 9:00, second relay about 10:30. Participants can choose to shoot either relay. Equipment requirements are minimal - a rifle, empty chamber indicator, ammunition, any type of basic rifle rest plus eye and ear protection. Spotting scopes are helpful but not necessary. Covid is winding down, the weather is warming up, and ammunition and components are back on the shelves so dust off that Springfield, Lee-Enfield, Mauser or whatever you may have and join us for an entertaining morning shooting these classic rifles. ## <u> General Meeting Minutes – March 4, 2022</u>

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 7:11 PM by Mark Eriksen. It was held at Goldsby.
- 2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
- 3. The Scheduler reported that next month (April and May) we have our 2 biggest events. The meetings will be held on Tuesdays, so that the meetings do not conflict with the events.
- 4. We will be hosting Ladies Day instead of Women on Target this year. Participants will get to spend more time with instructors, and we have also added pepper spray! There will be a class for holster selection. Ray's BBQ will be served for lunch. We need more female RSOs to assist. Please volunteer!
- 5. YHEC is scheduled for August 6th.
- 6. There will be more fundraising events for sporting clays. The St. Patrick's Day event will be held on March 13th and will include a potluck.

- 7. The card reader system for the shotgun range has been updated. It uses a reloadable card that can be purchased in the Stat House. All the new equipment is on site. Electrical work will start soon. There will not be a senior discount.
- 8. The 100-yard target boards were attached to the ground.
- 9. April 16th will be a workday and Vintage Battle Rifle.
- 10. Kevan Riley explained the Apple Seed program. Appleseed focuses on history and marksmanship skills. Appleseed will be scheduling events at the range again this year.
- 11. We need more Sportsfest participants. It's \$25 per participant. The Civil War cannon will be there.
- 12. There are 4 "Run and Gun" competitions in the state. If you are interested, contact Kevan Riley.
- 13. The President reported we need additional young RSOs. Please contact the CRSO or Member at Large if you are interested in training as an RSO. They will help to get you in touch with the right people. In January we certified 6 new RSOs, and in February we certified 8 new RSOs. Thank you, Ken, for providing the training! Ken Anderson reported that in the future, RSO certification classes will be split into 2 and/or 3-hour sessions.
- 14. Simm Rudnick reported that Youth Archery consistently has at least 20 participants each week! We teach the same course of fire on the archery range as on the other ranges, so that kids trained at youth archery can transition to other ranges with ease.
- 15. A member reported that his granddaughter participated in the Junior Olympics, brought home the gold, and will be going to nationals!
- 16. The Vice President reported that we are getting ready for Sportsfest! We are raising money to help support the kids, there are raffle tickets available for purchase for \$20 per ticket; or 3 for \$50; or 7 for \$100.
- 17. We are sad to report that Bob Touchstone passed away last month.
- 18. The Chief Range Safety Officer reported we have introduced a few new members.
- 19. We are exploring how the range is used for commercial use by members. Please remember that if you are at the range for commercial use, members always take precedence! Please make sure to provide a certificate of insurance and seek approval before taking action. If you are using the range for commercial use, please contact Hazen for approval. If you have any questions, talk to Hazen.
- 20. Please use chamber flags! If you see another member without one, please encourage them to use one! A member asked, "If my bolt has been removed, do I still need an open chamber indicator?" The answer is, **YES!**
- 21. A supplemental for the practical pistol match is planned. Tanner Williams, the 3 Gun Match director, spoke about a supplement for a 2-gun match (rifle and pistol). The proceeds will go to the McClain County reserves program. There will be a lot of law enforcement officers participating. It will be held on April 3rd starting at 9AM. They will still pay the standard \$2.00 per person fee to the club.
- 22. The Secretary asked that every voting member who had not voted on the bylaw change needs to vote! Your votes matter! Only 22 more votes were needed for a quorum.
- 23. Maintenance reported that we will need to do some range closures for spraying.
- 24. The Member at Large reported nothing and seemed really happy about it.
- 25. The Treasurer reported that this year we have restarted the process of exploring investment opportunities for the club's idle funds. Hopefully we will have that process started in the next month.
- 26. The financials will be available on the website for review.
- 27. There was a raffle.
- 28. The meeting was adjourned at 8:14PM by Mark Eriksen.

#### Officer Meeting Minutes – March 17, 2022

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.
- 2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
- 3. About fifty kids have signed up for sportsfest. We still need muzzle loader help. Portable toilets have been ordered. Tomahawk is just going to be a Boy Scout event. The range will be shut down Friday evening at 4:00 p.m. to allow time for setup.
- 4. Investment research is ongoing. We are looking at plans and policies.

- 5. Electronic waivers were discussed. This is something that we need to do. We have no efficient way to search through existing waivers. A dedicated waiver software solution may be our best option. A kiosk could be put into place for those without their own devices.
- 6. We need to move toward standardizing administrative activities at the club. A meeting needs to be held for match directors, discipline directors, safety coordinators, etc...
- 7. Concerns were raised regarding matches and disciplines. It would be helpful to verify that each discipline and event has a consistent SOP and a safety plan in place and copies available during the event.
- 8. We would like to encourage first aid and stop the bleed training.
- 9. General event planning and follow up was discussed. One of our best resources is a vendor list. The Scheduler is building a vendor list.
- 10. Bylaws change passed. All spouse and comp members are now associate members. The bylaws will be updated. The club is one person short of being full. An email will be sent to affected members. Most of the affected members will be eligible to become regular members. There was some discussion regarding additional bylaw changes for the cap and the NRA requirement.
- 11. There was discussion and enthusiasm about switching to a rolling membership model.
- 12. There was additional discussion about moving to quarterly new membership.
- 13. Targets on the pistol range are falling over. Sandbags get shot up and tend to make a mess. Other solutions could create ricochet risks. Several viable options were provided and will be tested.
- 14. There was discussion regarding maintaining an ideas list as a Google doc for ideas coming from members. The board was generally interested in this. The member at large will curate it.
- 15. There was discussion and debriefing following an accidental discharge on the range. CRSO presented details. A match guest's leg was injured by an accidental discharge from his own firearm. The discharge was ultimately the responsibility of the shooter.
- 16. The meeting was adjourned at 8:49 p.m.
