Range Maintenance

Workdays this summer will be random. We will schedule around events. Please check the calendar for dates or contact maintenance to schedule your work hours or register online.

Check calendar and entrance for range closures. Some closures may be unannounced with intention of being very brief.

The Short Rifle Range backstop will be getting maintenance. The schedule of short rifle range closures will be pending weather and the availability of materials. There will be unexpected closures for the delivery of materials and earthwork. New parking stops will be installed in front of shotgun ranges very soon.

- **Long-Range Targets** Please do not move the large target boards (100yrd) on the long-range. They have been staked.
- **Shotgun Patterning Board Located at Hand Thrower Area**

Shooting at the hand thrower area is to take place at the covered area, using PVC shooting stands, and shooting downrange. NO SLUGS. If you are unclear of what down range is, please, pack up your guns and go home.

Notice-For the safety of the members and their guests and as a courtesy to all, please clean up after yourself if you have an injury or accident. Bloodborne Pathogens can cause several serious and potentially fatal diseases. The bathrooms have cleaning supplies available in the cabinets.

***This message applies to the clean-up of the men's restroom toilet area. Several members have reported to the board the men's restroom condition and deemed it to be a health hazard. Restrooms found to be unsafe will be condemned until they are detailed and rendered safe to the public. Your splatter matters....

SPEED LIMIT 10

NOTICE!! 10MPH or less Please. Volunteer workers, shooters (especially archery), and the vehicle behind you don't want a huge cloud of dust in their face or settling on their firearms and vehicles. Please

slow down to 10MPH or less. Observe the cloud of dust behind you.

Do not stop at the gate when entering the club. If you stop and wait for the gate to close, when you proceed, you will trigger gate to reopen. Do not stop and block a car from following you in. Wait to identify membership after parking on range.

Every 2nd and 4th Thursday, TCGC Youth Archery regularly has 15 to 20 participants. Over time the faces change, but the program remains, safety, fundamentals, fun, and fellowship.



Safety Report

<u>Firearm left at Range</u>: A firearm was found, secured and returned to member. A reminder that our process is to secure any firearm found at range and to require serial number for claim. Call CRSO if you leave firearm at range, I will meet you ASAP. Suggest members label guns, or at least their bags/cases, to enable quick contact. A tip - list of serial numbers will also serve if needed for insurance or to reclaim from police if recovered after theft.

<u>Damaged Target Stands</u>: A member noticed a hole through top corner of one gong frame at 200 yards. That frame is AR500 steel. A reminder that Armor Piercing rounds are prohibited per range rule #11. Both wood stands at 25-yard berm on long range were destroyed, assume by turkey loads. Range rule #13 asks members to provide cardboard targets for patterning of large shot, to avoid destroying club targets and frames.

<u>Direction of Fire</u>: Members were observed engaging patterning board while aimed toward the conex. Range rule #13 will be updated and members are reminded of the fourth safety rule, as quoted in our range rules: "Know your target and what's beyond".

Range Rule Update: Considering frame damage and error with patterning board as noted above, range rule #13 will be updated as follows (new underlined).

Shotgun Shot Size and Targets: Only lead shot size 7 ½, 8, 9 or 10 or size 7 steel is to be used on the Shotgun Ranges and on the patterning board. Patterning board is to be placed directly in front of the informal range and engaged from the informal firing line. On the Long Range, size 7 shot or larger (7, 6, 4, 2, buckshot etc.) may be shot only at member-provided cardboard targets, placed in front of a berm. Shotgun slugs or rifled sabots may be fired at club-provided targets.

As always shoot straight, place targets at a height so that bullets impact the lower 2/3rds of the backstop, and don't destroy the frames. Use and be aware of the red lights. Always be deliberate in your actions with firearms.

- b. Encourage people to look into the Murray State College NRA Summer Gunsmith programs! Meeting Adjourned at 7:55 p.m.

Officer Meeting Minutes – April 21, 2022 revised

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.
- 2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
- 3. There was discussion of the layout and geography of the long range to better understand backstop and side berm placement. No blue sky is still one of the more preferred options for containment. Several different containment options were considered for future use.
- 4. YHEC and other event planning was discussed. Establishing event pages and sending out an email blast was floated.
- 5. The board is going to work to better organize the tomahawk offerings at club events. Capacity, range, and the number of throwers that can be accommodated, and rules are all being explored.
- 6. Sportsfest was full. An after action review was done and a report is being compiled.
- 7. Board is looking into hosting a first aid course to be offered to club members.
- 8. The club has some .357 magnum ammo that it doesn't need. It can be sold during the swap meet. We also have .22 bolt actions that we can sell off. There are also some camp hatches that can be eliminated
- 9. There will be a tiered email distribution system for elected board members and officers.
- 10. A safety plan is under development. Board members were asked to provide feedback. Match directors have been consulted and are receptive for SOPs.
- 11. Providing or hosting a regular first aid course is something that the board is interested in.
- 12. What may be counted as work hours was discussed. Work hours must be completed performing tasks that a member of the board has solicited. No tasks performed for any business or other forprofit purpose may be considered for work hours. Time spent as a participant may not be credited toward work hours. Only board members may enter work hours. In order to be eligible to earn work hours as an RSO, the RSO must be, or have been, a certified NRA RSO.
- 13. Membership is currently full. The membership application will reopen later in the year, if/when openings become available.
- 14. The board is reviewing the value of waivers.
- 15. The patterning board is on the shotgun range. Only lead shot size 7 ½, 8, 9 or 10 or size 7 steel is to be used on the Shotgun Ranges, including on the patterning board. The patterning board is to be placed directly in front of the informal range and may only be engaged from the informal firing line. Shot size 7 or larger (7, 6, 4, 2, buckshot etc.) may be used only on the long range and may only be fired at member-provided cardboard targets, on wooden target frames, placed in front of a berm. Shotgun slugs or rifled sabots may be fired at club-provided targets.
- 16. A new target type is being tested on the short rifle range.
- 17. Those members who were previously classified as spouse members may use their time as a spouse member toward regular and life membership. A spouse member who has been a spouse member for three or more consecutive years may become a regular member if they pay their land fund fee. A spouse member who has been a spouse member for eight or more consecutive years may become a life member if they pay their land fund fee and meet the age requirements.
- 18. The meeting was adjourned at 9:14 p.m.




