### <u>General Meeting Minutes – May 3, 2022</u>

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m.
- 2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
- 3. The Treasurer and Member at large were unable to attend, and no reports were given.
- 4. The Vice President commented that lots of kids were present for Thursday night's youth shotgun. However, there were no NRA grants this year, so she is holding a raffle of an AR15 to raise money to purchase targets.
- 5. CRSO reported that a gun was left on the range and subsequently returned to its owner. He further commented that if you find a firearm to contact him or another board member who will take charge of the weapon. It will be returned to its owner upon verification of the serial number.

- 6. Shooters were reminded to place targets in the center of the frame and to not shoot the frame. Frames cost money to replace. Shooters may bring their own cardboard targets and place them at the berm if using a shotgun on the long range.
- 7. It was noted that a person using the shotgun patterning board was aiming in the wrong direction, toward the conex. If the safe direction is not clear, ask for assistance.
- 8. Danny Thompson will be hosting Marine Corps veterans on April 21. He commented that other dedicated groups are coordinating shooting activities.
- 9. The scheduler reported that we have 60 ladies signed up for the club's upcoming women's shooting event. She mentioned they can use some help setting up. Contact Tara if you can assist.
- 10. The Maintenance Manager reiterated putting targets in the middle of the frames and taking care not to damage the frames. He also suggested that shooters may turn off and/or move the sprinklers if they are a hindrance. However, please remember to turn the sprinklers back on and put it back when finished.
- 11. Ken Anderson stated that YHEC is being planned for August 6 and he is working on staffing.
- 12. Simm Rudnick commented that we had 15 kids for last week's youth archery class and the kids had a ball shooting 3d targets.
- 13. There will be a battle rifle shoot on July 16. Unlike previous events ARs will be permitted but must have iron sights only, no optics.
- 14. The meeting was adjourned at 7:18 p.m.

### <u> Officer Meeting Minutes – May 19, 2022</u>

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.
- 2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
- 3. Maintenance of shotgun carts and other discipline equipment was discussed. Each discipline is expected to perform maintenance on discipline specific equipment.
- 4. Email addresses for match directors/disciplines are necessary for timely communication. We can develop distribution groups that correspond to generalized email addresses.
- 5. Financials are ready to be posted.
- 6. The range rules were discussed. Updates were posted to the Hangfire. No negative feedback was received. There is interest in breaking the range rules into administrative rules and range rules. This will help to ease review of the rules.
- 7. We are increasing the size of the upcoming RSO class but are also breaking it up the instruction from one session to two.
