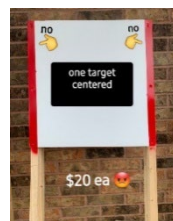

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m.
2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
3. Trimming will be done on the upcoming workday. We may have to close some ranges.
4. We may have to inspect the brick/rock wall after the rains.
5. Beavers are building dams again, but at a different location this time. No new water is collecting on our property.
6. RSO volunteers for ladies' day were discussed.
7. Two members requested events.
8. There will be more upcoming RSO classes.
9. Several folks are reaching out to the member at large asking when they can join. We are a full gun club. Check the website regularly for when new member applications open.
10. Kevan Riley expressed his thanks for use of the range for Camp & Shoot, Sportsfest, and Appleseed.
11. Youth shooting events are held every second and fourth Thursday night. Events are going very well.
12. Secretary answered some questions about the recent bylaw change.
13. The finance committee is discussing an investment plan.
14. It was noted that workday and MBABR are on the same day.
15. Family Day is coming up.
16. The Event coordinator discussed recruiting for events. Hunters Education and Camp & Shoot are on the schedule.
17. The meeting was adjourned at 7:22 p.m.

Officer Meeting Minutes – June 16, 2022

1. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
3. The treasurer was absent.
4. A small semi-automatic shotgun was ordered for youth shooters. Kids are enjoying it. More clays are being purchased for youth shotgun. They go through a couple of cases per shoot. Youth has continued to have good turnout.
5. Bank account options are still being explored. Interest rates are relatively low across the board.
6. Ken will be hosting another RSO training class. The class will be held in two parts. Ken will be using the Stat house and will reconfigure the space into a classroom for the duration of the two classes.
7. A draft waiver is in process of being developed. Most of the existing waiver content will be retained. A paper waiver option is not desired by the board. Electronic waivers can be integrated into existing event registrations. QR codes will be used to facilitate signing waivers with the user's phone or other personal device. Users without personal devices will be able to access a club owned tablet kiosk at the Stat house. Tablet kiosks are sufficiently inexpensive to install and maintain as to be considered disposable. David will write an article.
8. There was discussion regarding granting editing access to the range rules on the website to the CRSO on the website. The rules are kept in two locations, one on the website and the other on a word document that is imported. There was some debate on the subject. The subject was tabled for the time being.
9. There is interest in bringing more youthful shooters and specifically RSOs to the club. RSO training is helping but may not be enough in the long run. We need to try to get experienced shooters to assist new shooters.
10. We need RSOs for the swap meet. There was discussion regarding getting better stools on the rifle range. It just happened that we already have some in storage. They will be brought out and cleaned up for use.
11. It was noted that the Hangfire should reflect upcoming events with more than just a link.
12. YHEC is at about 75% staffing. There are a couple of non-club member volunteers. This event is typically small but does require extensive setup.
13. Hunter Education is the next big event. Ken Anderson is the instructor of record. Cheryl Anderson is the event coordinator. This event will be managed entirely in the Department of Wildlife's systems.
14. Camp & Shoot is beginning to get planned.
15. The club has several donated items to be sold at the swap meet. Proceeds will go to youth events. A few of the tomahawks and camp axes will be sold as well.
16. It was noted that club owned addresses are being solicited by some members. It was noted that blocking and reporting is the best recourse.
17. More people are asking to join. We have no openings currently.
18. A member wants to run/jog around the range with a rifle for biathlon training. There are no great concerns with this. The firearm will need to be flagged with the action closed. The rifle will be pointed either muzzle up or muzzle down during transport. The member will wear his badge while running.
19. The family day picnic is in full swing.
20. It's time to get fire extinguishers replaced.
21. There was discussion regarding hosting FFA for another shoot. More discussion will be held with the central organization.
22. Appleseed is coming up on July 30th.
23. There was discussion regarding raising fees and possibly adjusting the work hours discount. Work hour discount will be retained and will remain at the same value for the time being. There was a motion to raise the rates by \$20 per year, per member, beginning with the 2023 membership year. The motion was seconded and approved by board members present, CRSO dissenting. It was noted that the discounted family rate will be adjusted to \$40 per year, per member.
24. The meeting was adjourned at 8:04 p.m.

Battle Rifle and AR RIFLE Match

We will have a Vintage Battle Rifle Match and AR Rifle match July 16 2022 at the long range:

For the Vintage battle rifle match, rifles used from WWII thru the Vietnam conflict that meet the following criteria are eligible. Rifles must be:

****30 calibe**

****semi-automati**

***no optics, and will include the M1, M1A, M1 carbine, cetme, FAL, AK47, SKS, and etc...**

This will be a bench rest type of match similar to the Military Bolt rifle matches. Two strings will be offhand. A sight in period of 10 minutes will precede each match..

For the AR rifle match, rifles must have "iron sights" no optics or Dots...same sequence of fire as battle match.

The battle rifle match will be first up and set up will begin @ 7:00, and match will start @ 8:00.

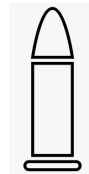
