The Short Rifle Range backstop will be getting maintenance. The schedule of short rifle range closures will be pending weather and the availability of materials. There will be unexpected closures for the delivery of materials and earthwork.

New parking stops will be installed in front of shotgun ranges very soon.

Long-Range Targets Please do not move the large target boards (100yrd) on the longrange. They have been staked.

Shotgun Patterning Board Located at Hand Thrower Area

Shooting at the hand thrower area is to take place at the covered area, using PVC shooting stands, and shooting downrange. NO SLUGS. If you are unclear of what down range is, please, pack up your guns and go home.

Do not stop at the gate when entering the club. If you stop and wait for the gate to close, when you proceed, you will trigger gate to reopen. Do not stop and block a car from following you in. Wait to identify membership after parking on range.

Safety Report

When I've been out to range past few weeks has been quiet, no surprise with our record setting temps. The forecast says breaking by the time you read this, so I hope you can get out to enjoy your range. A suggestion – if a while since you've been out, take a few minutes to review range safety rules, refresh memory. Rules are easy to access on TCGC website or in the red binders on each range.

<u>Range Safety Officers</u>: Several of our new RSOs have volunteered at recent events or matches – thank you. There are more opportunities coming for both new and experienced RSOs - YHEC, Hunter Ed, Scout Camp & Shoot ... and Match Directors can always use RSO help.

Gate Access and Badges: Nothing else to discuss for safety so thought I'd share an observation. After reviewing with the Board, we felt it worth mentioning. A member observed a suspicious lady on property. When I asked if she is member, she had a "story" and soon became rather belligerent. I advised her that the club is private property and (politely) asked her to leave. But a few weeks later, during Thursday youth shoot, she was observed driving on property. The lesson here is that we need to watch for uninvited visitors and request to see their badge, if not visible. My suggestion on this is that we are a private club, we pay dues, and many of us volunteer much time for our club – so this is "our" club, don't hesitate to request badge. With that said, if you do get pushback don't put yourself in a bad spot, call McClain Sheriff if needed.

As always shoot straight, place targets at a height so that bullets impact the lower 2/3rds of the backstop and don't hit the sticks. Use and be aware of the red lights. Always be deliberate in your actions with firearms.

- 4. The Secretary, David Barbee, passed out Appleseed targets to members present and commented on how to use them. He reported that there will be an Appleseed event in July and members can get a discount by logging into the TCGC website and getting a code to fill out an application prior to the event. He stressed that Appleseed stressed in the dirt (no bench rest) military style shooting, however glass and optics are allowed if that meets your needs.
- 5. The Scheduler, Tara Nelson, reported that all is quiet. As maintenance manager, she asked that if you need to turn off or borrow a hose, please return to where and how you found it.
- 6. The Member at Large, Robert Powell, had nothing to report.
- 7. The Maintenance Manager reported that the gate is currently undergoing repair, please be patient if it is slow to open or is doing something strange.
- 8. Brass will be in the Stat House on the 2nd of July.

- 9. Ken Anderson stated that YHEC will be held on August 6th, and he is working on staffing. He especially needs muzzle loading instructors. He is also looking to staff the upcoming Hunters Education classes scheduled for November.
- 10. Scott Stenho reported that he will be open for business on the 2nd of July and will have several different types of ammunition and firearms for sale on East Main in Moore.
- 11. The meeting was adjourned at 7:15 PM.

<u>Officer Meeting Minutes – July 21, 2022</u>

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.
- 2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
- 3. Ed Lyons spoke regarding security and offered to do security upgrades at cost. He can coordinate with existing security infrastructure. He recommended installing card readers with wireless capabilities and/or issuing unique PIN codes. Members could use a PIN code, use a phone app, can purchase a card, or can rent/borrow a fob. PIN codes could be a potential problem, as they can be shared. Cards, fobs, or personal phones are less likely to be shared. Compatibility with Wild Apricot needs to be assessed. The board would prefer that entry records that contain PII not be maintained. A Knox key for fire/medical/police access is something that we may be interested in. This topic will be tabled until more information is ready.
- 4. A woman, who is not a member or a guest, has been driving onto the range. Members are reminded to wear their badges while on the range.
- 5. YHEC is coming up. Only 5 participants are signed up. The event minimum is set at 15. The minimum must be met by July 29th. Portable toilets will not be necessary if numbers are low. Bottled water will be provided.
- 6. Hunter Education already has 11 participants signed up. It will be held regardless of numbers.
- 7. Camp & shoot is coming up and was discussed.
- 8. Central Region Sporting Clays is coming up and was discussed.
- 9. Renewals will be opened on the website later this year. October is anticipated.
- 10. A grant is going in for handicapped parking.
- 11. Youth sports will not be held if the temperature is over 100 degrees.
- 12. The meeting was adjourned at 7:40 p.m.
