President's Report

Club Members

A request was made for me to better explain wordage from the President's Corner 11/23/22

What I saw in the Board meeting was a number of shotgun shooters who feel they should be able to shoot for only the cost we pay for the clay targets, plus a 10% add for lost/broken targets and 10% add for ONLY clay target machine throwers. Any other maintenance or future updating of shotgun infrastructure they want to come from all of the membership dues. When I look at this way of thinking, they don't want to build up any type of savings account for their shotgun discipline. When

we first started shotgun, there was extra money built up from the rounds shot. This, along with fundraising is where we got funds to add to the shotgun sports.

Details

A shotgun committee was formed to address pricing. A little over halfway through the meeting, James Greenwood talked about adding some money into the rounds for future expansion. I did not hear anyone speak up to agree with him. There was some talk about the sporting clays project and it was stated that they could not find where there was a vote by the members to have the club buy the machines and that " shotgun " would be : Just Read it:

General Meeting Minutes – January 5, 2021 1. 7:00 Meeting Called to Order. Over 40 people attended the Virtual Meeting! Went great for first try. 2. Motion to Approve Minutes of Last Meeting. Discussion ensued about when was the last meeting. Upon review of Hangfire the last Club Meeting was October 2, 2020. Motion was seconded and approved. 3. Sporting Clays: Discussion of the Sporting Clay. Proposal was displayed online. a. The votes from members in attendance was unanimously yes and their votes were recorded and counted. The online vote will remain open till Friday and results will be emailed to the membership. b. Tara Addressed the Method of payment. Part of the equipment purchased will allow the use of prepaid cards with a Kiosk in the Stat House to reload funds using a credit card. c. The Cards count the targets and store information. d. The funds will come from the 2021 budgeted Range Improvements. The Shotgun funds will be used to help pay for additional building materials for the course. Volunteers will be doing most of the work and the club has received several donations of the materials needed, e. The proposal is available in the "News" online and includes the Estimated date of completion in the Fall of 2021.XXA question about Handicap access was raised. The course is about 500 vards and will allow Golf Cart or ATV access. Vehicles will be able to park along the road between the gate and the curve to access the range.

All of the pricing by the "shotgun committee, as stated by them, is from assumptions and now everyone has to admit there was a vote and passed. It took me 10minutes to find the results under documents then Hangfire. At the end of the shotgun committee meeting, they did not add any amount for future shotgun developments to the pricing.

Now, the next step is they bring their proposal to the board meeting and through the discussion still nothing for the future of the shotgun sports. It comes down to they are wanting to vote on their pricing (with nothing added for the future funding). I then told them that for now they should at least add one cent per clay target because there was a vote by the members. There was some discussion and they said that would be ok.

I have been working on the numbers to determine how many shotgun shooters there actually are, how much they shot, and how much money was taken in for 2022. When I finish it, it will be published.

We are finishing the transition between banks; it will make it easier for events. We are working on definitions and requirements for disciplines. This includes match coordinators and scorers, etc. Each discipline needs to have a committee. The participant fees will continue. We will standardize the way these disciplines will be treated. The financials will change to support this.
- 7. The Scheduler reported that as far as shotgun goes, please use the PVC stands on the extended concrete. There is not a patterning board there right now. In April, we will resume meetings at the club.

It will be on the first Tuesday of the month. Jamie Meyer introduced herself. There is one GSSF match this year in Oklahoma City. There are 3 stages: it is simple and competitive. There were 128 female entries. You have to shoot a Glock. There are many different levels of competition. It's open all weekend and you can come and go depending on when you would like to compete. The January workday will be next weekend, the 14th. We are sharing some workdays with the vintage battle rifles matches. Practical pistol will be the first Sunday of the month.

 standards. If a discipline does not have a committee, the board will serve as the committee for that
 discipline.
- 3. There was some discussion regarding a Hangfire article concerning the cost of clays that was established during a previous meeting. There was disagreement regarding the accuracy of the article under discussion. Clarification was requested concerning where the point of contention was. Clarification was provided, indicating that the intent of some members was mischaracterized. With greater clarity, the article's writer ultimately decided that a portion of the article would be corrected.
- 4. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
- 5. Sportsfest was discussed. A planning document was presented. It will be shared to the Drive later. A P-card is needed for meal purchasing. We are aiming to eliminate out of pocket expenses.

- 14. We are moving forward with electronic waivers, as per previous discussion.


