TCGC Junior Member is now a Top 10 Women's Rifle Athlete in the nation!

Elisa Boozer, a 16-year-old sophomore at Moore High School and TCGC Junior Member and granddaughter of TCGC members Vince & Marietta Dennis, recently represented Oklahoma at her 3rd consecutive USA Shooting Junior Olympic Shooting Championship at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, CO from April 8-15. The rifle athletes that attended this invitation-only national match consisted of the top under-21 rifle shooters in the nation, including current college and national team members.

Elisa qualified to participate in both of the main Olympic events (60 Shots Standing 10m Precision Air Rifle and 3x20 Shots 3-Position 50m Precision Smallbore Rifle). The USJOSC is the premier national match for U-21 shooters and helps qualify athletes to get on the US Olympic Development teams.

Although Elisa has qualified in the past in air rifle, this was Elisa's first time to qualify in smallbore. She scored a 2-day integer total of 1125/1200 and finished 76th of 118 women overall, and 31st out of 53 women in the U-18 category.

The 10m Standing Air Rifle event consists of 120 shots scored using decimals (10.0 = just touched the line, 10.9 = center punched the target). This is Elisa's specialty, and she scored a 2-day total of 1234.2, coming in 37th out of 250 total women, and 10th in the nation as one of the youngest in the U-18 category. Her 2nd day score also set a personal best integer score (what NCAA rifle coaches look at) of 592/600. Remember, that 10-ring is only 5mm in diameter!

While Elisa will be the first to tell you there is still lots of work to do, she shot well and had a good time. Next up: The CMP Nationals in July at Camp Perry where she qualified individually and will also

be part of a team from OK called the Sharpshooters competing in 3-position air rifle - the first team from OK to qualify in over 20 years.

If you have a junior shooter that is interested in this amazing Olympic and NCAA scholarship sport, please get them involved in the junior programs at TCGC and 4H. That's where Elisa started!

General Meeting Minutes – April 4, 2023

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m.
- 2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
- 3. The Chief Range Safety Office reported that Sportsfest was safe! The guest waiver is now available electronically. It is still required once a year. Our responsibility is to keep a handle on our guests.
- 4. The Vice President Office reported that Jack Christopherson is a youth shooter who reached the distinguished expert level in trap.

- 5. Mike Whittaker reported that April 23rd there will be a memorial of Chris Everett here at the club. There will be a cannon shot off at noon in honor of him.
- 6. Vintage battle and MBABR matches are this Saturday, and next weekend is the vintage battle rifle match. AR-15's are welcome.
- 7. The Secretary reported, if anyone needs to cast a vote for the bylaw proposal on paper, come see me.
- 8. Kevan Riley reported that we had a great Sportsfest last Saturday! Thank you for helping us put on a safe, fun event!
- 9. The Scheduler reported that May 6th is the Women on Target event, there are only 6 spots left.
- 10. Ken Anderson reported that we had a family come all the way from Dallas to participate in Sportsfest. The next event is YHEC on June 3rd. It is an opportunity for young people to compete in hunting skills. It is an NRA sponsored event.
- 11. The meeting was adjourned at 7:15 p.m.

Officer Meeting Minutes – April 20, 2023

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 6:41 p.m.
- 2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
- 3. Ken Anderson reported that the Chris Everson memorial service is on Sunday. We need to know who on board will attend so he can plan on the amount of food. The cannon will be shot off around 10 AM. We plan to shoot the cannon on the shotgun range. The backup plan is the long range. There is water access at both points for safety. We are expecting around 25 shotgun members with their spouses, plus around 25 more. The next event is Ladies Day. It was reported that administratively, we will need help checking in participants in the morning. We have all the ammunition and firearms needed. The pistol and short rifle range will house the pistol event. There will be three groups. YHEC is on the 3rd of June. Shotgun will run a mini 5 stand. This is not a training event; we will not be doing any coaching. We will use the same targets as last year. Hunter's Ed is in September, the 16th is the tentative date. Camp and Shoot has been confirmed for the 14th of October 2024.
- 4. Mike Whittaker reported that the nominating committee is trying to get the open slots filled. We need people to be part of the club, which means participating. Donations are greatly appreciated.
- 5. The Chief Range Safety Office reported that we will leave the rule about the patterning board in the bylaws. There is no rush to change it. At Sportsfest, a question was asked about the concrete bench. We
 will be repositioning the concrete bench on the long range for the 50 BMG. Also, it was suggested that
 muzzle loader companies go obsolete quickly. The suggestion is that the club buy our own
 muzzleloaders, sell the old ones to the members, and use the money to purchase new muzzleloaders.
 We should be able to find them for around \$250.00 each. A suggestion was made to purchase extra
 parts, or an extra muzzle loader. The muzzleloaders we currently have were purchased with an NRA
 grant from 2015, we need to get permission from the NRA to sell them. It should not be a problem. We
 are looking into a new rule about drawing from a holster.
- 6. The Vice President Office reported that we will look into replacing the muzzleloaders before next year and consult with the NRA. YHEC is the next big event, it will be featured in the Hangfire. We only need 15-20 people from the club for this event. Ladies Day will also be in the next Hangfire. The ladies multigun event was discussed.
- 7. The Treasurer Office reported that he will serve as the treasurer for another year, he would like an assistant appointed, to start training someone to take over. The P cards are available. The safety deposit box will be moved soon. The tablet is ready to go. It will be mounted on the wall. We will eventually be able verify that guests have filled out a waiver on the website. Programmatically, it will get smoothed out. We also have the ability to have multiple waivers on the site, we can have specific waivers for each event. We need to figure out how to denote the waivers for kids. When payments for the disciplines are moved online, we will be able to correlate the waiver and payment. The number one reason for the waiver is to inform guests about the risks of participating. The waiver also has value as far as the insurance is concerned. The RV was discussed. Where should it be moved? The county owns the land where it is located. It is a sanitary issue. The owner has been contacted. If we don't have an answer by May 4th, we will hire someone to haul it off.
- 8. The Scheduler reported that within the next 2 to 4 days the squading and staffing will be finalized for Ladies Day. The main focus is coordinating the staff for the rifle event. We will coordinate with the

- Range Safety Officer to make sure all are on board. There will be pop up targets. We will be rotating events for next year.
- 9. The Member at Large reported that new members will need to verify that they are NRA members. He received an email from a gentleman who attended the vintage battle rifle match. He was very happy with the event and would like to attend another. Many members have asked to have their badges sent out via mail. We will not send the badges through the mail. Membership will open up on June 6th.
- 10. The meeting was adjourned at 8:10 p.m.

Bylaw Amendment that changes membership start and end dates to be the date that the member joined the club (instead of every membership being January and ending in December) and makes renewals due one year after joining the club (instead of October of every year).

This eliminates confusion caused by renewals being due in October even though memberships don't end until December. This also makes renewals and opening up for new members easier to manage which will contribute to the mission of our club to grow the shooting sports.

Section 3.01 will be changed to read as follows:

Section 3.01. ELIGIBILITY. Any citizen or legal resident of the United States twenty-one (21) years of age or older, legally able to handle firearms, and a member of the National Rifle Association (NRA) may become a member of this organization after meeting all of the following conditions: a) passing the administrative and safety rules quiz as determined by the board, b) completing a Range & Safety Orientation, c) paying the current initiation fees and dues established by the board, and d) subscribing to the following pledge, to-wit: [pledge remains unchanged]


Section 3.012 will be changed to read as follows:

Section 3.012. TERMS OF MEMBERSHIP. Memberships shall be valid for one (1) year (a) beginning on the effective date of membership (join date) noted in the member's membership record or (b) beginning on the anniversary of the join date. Membership requires the individual member (a) complete and submit an application for membership or renewal, as designated by the board, (b) demonstrate understanding of TCGC administrative and safety rules, and c) pay any dues and fees required within one (1) month of their join date or for subsequent years of membership, within one (1) month the anniversary of the member's join date. Failure to complete the membership requirements will result in the termination of membership. Former members, other than life members, must apply as a "New Member."

Section 3.013 will be deleted; its contents have been incorporated into 3.012
