The President's Hundred is one of the nation's most venerable sporting events, with a longevity and history as distinguished as the Kentucky Derby, organized baseball, or the America's Cup. Like the Derby it only happens once a year at a very special location. Like professional baseball many players start the season but only a few will be on a World Series winning team in any given year. Like the America's Cup it is an event where the basics skills for success have not changed in 130 years, but the technology has opened whole new vistas. Membership in the Presidents Hundred and Distinguished status are the Gemini Twins, the Castor and Pollux, in the firmament of the service arm competitor, yet they are different-not identical twins, but fraternal, if you will. The quest for Distinguished is a marathon while the chase for the Presidents is a 100-meter dash. The President's Match is once a year happening and an event where there is no room for error because, like the dash,

it is over quickly but like the marathon, the field is huge and crowded with talent, making it harder to earn. Simply put, there is a greater percentage of Distinguished shooters in the ranks of the Presidents Hundred than there are Presidents Hundred members in the Distinguished rolls. Skilled competitors certainly have an advantage in the Presidents Match but there is always enough uncertainty in a short match to make things interesting. ### <u>Safety Report</u>

First Aid/CPR/AED Training with FAST (First Aid for Severe Trauma): A reminder about courses, see Safety Corner in July Hangfire for details, email to undersigned if interested. Those who have signed up have received invites for course choices in August.

Short Shotguns: Members spoke to me with concerns, we discussed, and I answered, but I think should communicate to the wider membership in this article. The observation was short Bullpup style shotgun at 5 Stand, with a concern for potential to sweep past the cage. My initial response was as it has been about race guns, short barrel rifles, etc. that safety is driven by the user, not the gun style (providing of course that gun is legal, operable, and serviceable). With few exceptions already in our existing Range Rules, don't think we should "ban" guns, need to be guided by our Club's mission objective to "promote safe participation in legitimate shooting sports". As a follow-up to those discussions, I discussed with the member involved to get his perspective - nobody had expressed any concern to him. This gets back to my point in June Hangfire – if we see something, say something. Members, especially RSOs, should address concerns at the time, politely of course. I hope this answers everyone.

As always - when you are out enjoying your range, please do so safely. Always heed the red lights, and always be deliberate in your actions with firearms. If you ever have any questions, issues or concerns about safety at our range feel free to contact me.

Please do not call or text asking for the gate code. The gate code WILL NOT be given to you. You will need to log in to your TCGC profile to obtain the code. It changes each month on any given day.

Randy and I have done the best we can to minimize sudden range closures for maintenance. The weather this year has been a challenge for the club regarding mowing, spraying, and a few other projects. However, there is always that member that shows up to shoot and sees the range is closed and leaves angry. We have asked those members kindly reach out to us when the range is closed. You may have been 5 minutes away from an open range.

- 1 target centered on pistol & short rifle range targets.
- Shot size allowed on shotgun ranges is still 7 ½, 7 steel, 8, 9. Larger shot sizes (6, 4, 2, buckshot, & slugs are only allowed on Long Range.
- pistol & short-range targets should be removed from shooting range and placed in target area after use.


