Safety Report

First Aid/CPR/AED with First Aid for Severe Trauma: As I write this, we have completed first course with 10 students. Thanks, Wes Tebo, for instruction. By time you read this a second course will be completed for another 10. I am maintaining a wait list for a potential third course if there is enough interest, so let me know if you'd like to be added.



Shotgun Shot Size, Patterning: We had another incident of wrong shot size on shotgun area, this one at patterning board, damaged by buckshot, (see picture at left). Part of my role is to have a chat with the member(s) but another (more detailed) reminder to all is

warranted. Per my discussions in recent Hangfire issues, if we see our fellow members heading in wrong direction, we need to help them correct.

Range rule #13 sets max size lead 7 ½ or steel 7 on <u>ALL</u> Shotgun Ranges, this includes Informal Range and patterning board. I ask that members consider the reason for this rule - from shotgun firing points the Club boundary is just beyond tree line. Also consider the dangerous (or lethal) ranges of buckshot, slugs, etc. Remember that we as shooters are

responsible for our shots to end of travel. NRA rule #4 - be sure of your target and what's beyond.

For members who wish to pattern larger shot, that same rule states that 7, 6, 4, 2, buckshot etc. may be shot at cardboard targets placed in front of a berm on Long Range. Shotgun slugs or rifled sabots may be fired at club-provided targets.

With all the above stated, I will add that we've been talking about options for patterning. So as always let me know requests/suggestions for setup of safe activities. With that said, we must follow current safety rules until changed for new facilities. Operate within the rules, work to improve and change the rules if/when need.

As always - when you are out enjoying your range, please do so safely. Always heed the red lights, and always be deliberate in your actions with firearms. If you ever have any questions, issues or concerns about safety at our range feel free to contact me.

Range Maintenance

Please do not call or text asking for gate code. The gate code WILL NOT be given to you. You will need to log in to your TCGC profile to obtain the code. It changes each month on any given day.

Randy and I have done the best we can to minimize sudden range closures for maintenance. The weather this year has been a challenge for the club regarding mowing, spraying, and a few other projects. However, there is always that member that shows up to shoot and sees the range is closed and leaves angry. We have asked that those members kindly reach out to us when range is closed. You may have been 5 min away from an open range.

Sign up for workday, projects, or event prep. Make friends while getting much needed chores and projects completed. Just let maintenance know if you have time or skills to contribute.

A few reminders to help keep your range awesome:

- Speed Limit is 10mph or less.
- 1 target centered on pistol & short rifle range targets.
- Shot size allowed on shotgun ranges is still
 7 ½, 7 steel, 8, 9. Larger shot sizes (6, 4, 2,
- buckshot, & slugs are only allowed on Long Range
- pistol & short-range targets should be removed from shooting range and placed in target area after use.

<u>General Meeting Minutes – August 1, 2023</u>

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 7:05PM by President, Mark Eriksen.
- 2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
- 3. The Chief Range Safety Officer, Hazen Bazinet, cautioned members to be aware of the heat and to watch out for others on the range.
- 4. The Secretary, David Barbee, passed out Appleseed targets to members present and commented on how to use them. He reported that there will be an Appleseed event in July and members can get a discount by logging into the TCGC website and getting a code to fill out an application prior to the event. He stressed that Appleseed stressed in the dirt (no bench rest) military style shooting, however glass and optics are allowed if that meets your needs.
- 5. The Scheduler, Tara Nelson, reported that all is quiet. As maintenance manager, she asked that if you need to turn off or borrow a hose, please return to where and how you found it.
- 6. The Member at Large, Robert Powell, had nothing to report.
- 7. The Maintenance Manager reported that the gate is currently undergoing repair, please be patient if it is slow to open or is doing something strange.
- 8. Brass will be in the Stat House on the 2nd of July.
- 9. Ken Anderson stated that YHEC will be held on August 6th, and he is working on staffing. He especially needs muzzle loading instructors. He is also looking to staff the upcoming Hunters Education classes scheduled for November.
- 10. Scott Stehno reported that he will be open for business on the 2nd of July and will have several different types of ammunition and firearms for sale on East Main in Moore.
- 11. The meeting was adjourned at 7:15 PM.

Officer Meeting Minutes – August 17, 2023

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.
- 2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
- 3. Hunter Education is next month. Final planning items were discussed. Gate codes will be issued. Waivers will be set up for the event. A tablet will be made available for completing waivers. Lunch will be provided to all attendees, including parents. Information regarding youth events at the club will be provided. Local FFA and 4H chapters have been notified. Set-up will be done beginning the Thursday night before the event.
- 4. Camp & Shoot is in October. Overnight camping is planned. Detail planning is in progress. Requests for support will begin in September.
- 5. Anyone who shoots at TCGC must complete a TCGC electronic waiver. We need to ensure that all guests, including guests attending with organizations holding events, must sign electronic waivers, regardless of having previously completed a paper waiver in the past or not. A template document will be generated for communication with organizations to ensure that they understand the requirement.
- 6. Dirt work on the long range was discussed. Additional 25-yard berms were requested to be placed on the long range. A proposal was developed to expand additional 25-yard berms to a total of three that would allow for about four times the current shooting space at 25 yards. Part of the proposal will include correcting the alignment of the current 25-yard berms. Space will be retained between berms to accommodate walking and vehicle pass-through. Fresh dirt would be used. The board was in general

agreement with the proposal. Regular users of the long range, including MBAR and Appleseed are positive toward the upgrade. A vote will be held once cost is determined. Target anchors were also discussed.

- 7. The first First Aid course filled within an hour of being posted. A second was filled and there is a waiting list for a possible third course. Wes will verify that participants have completed their homework prior to attending the class. It was noted that participants will get an email stating that they are "complete" for each portion.
- 8. A report was provided regarding the <u>Oklahoma Shooting Sports Association</u> banquet. It was run moreor-less like an NRA event and went well. The club received a \$200 gift card from H&H. We will enter a grant reguest with the organization. More information can be found at https://www.ok-ssa.org/.
- 9. The Youth Glock League's first session went well and was well attended. It's second session was in progress at the time of the officer's meeting and was also well attended. It is being held the first and third Thursday of each month.
- 10. We need black powder. We will submit a public support request with Bass Pro.
- 11. It was noted that it would be helpful to have a webpage that identifies all the organizations that the club supports. The club also needs to compile a list of contacts and contact information for each of these organizations. This contact list will be stored on the drive, not on the website. A similar contact list is being compiled for the club's service providers and vendors.
- 12. The *Discipline Document* will be shared with all board members. It serves as a complete manual for running a discipline at TCGC. Disciplines will be established following similar procedures to club committees. Each discipline will require an established set of governing rules. Collection of discipline funds, event sign-ups, event waivers, etc. are all covered in the document. This document will help to ensure each discipline receives equal treatment. Once the board has reviewed and accepted the document, the document will become effective and will be presented to the membership. The board will approve or deny the document at or prior to the next meeting.
- 13. Reimbursement and/or disbursements must be submitted using the authorized electronic or hardcopy request form and must be reviewed and approved by a board member other than the treasurer. The electronic form is preferred. Receipts must be submitted with the request. We would also like to begin using alternate payment services, as they are easier and faster to deal with. For larger expenditures, a P-card should be considered, as they are easier to track, more convenient, and save the member from expending their own funds.
- 14. We have people trying to join. There are a few items that need to be finalized. Software testing is near completion. A notification will be sent to members. It was noted that the board is made up of volunteers who have jobs and lives of their own. Membership renewal has long been a time-consuming endeavor. This upgrade will make substantial improvements but is a big lift. Thus, patience is appreciated. Member types were discussed. There are three types or groups of members; members whose memberships end on October 31st, members whose membership ends on December 31st, and everyone else. Membership dates will be normalized to December 31st for existing members to ensure that no paid membership time is lost. For new members, the membership renewal date will be set to the date the member filled out the application. Members will be allowed to renew early. Articles will be written for the Hangfire to ensure that members are aware of the changes.
- 15. Five-Stand will be held every Saturday.
- 16. The meeting was adjourned at 8:51 p.m.




