Safety Report

Seems like fall has arrived, so I hope you get out to enjoy our range.

First Aid/CPR/AED with First Aid for Severe

Trauma: As I write this, we have completed second course with 9 students. Thanks again Wes Tebo for instruction. By time you read this the third and final course will complete for another 10. This training has increased our odds of having a certified member on range should the need ever arise. With that said, let's all keep our focus on safety, try not to need that help.

Discipline Guidance: As you may have noted from Board Meeting Minutes in past Hangfires, we have been working on a "Discipline Guidance" document. Two key elements in the Safety Section that thought I'd share here, primarily for Match Directors as discussed with most of you, but also for info to members who shoot matches. 1) New Shooters Briefings were mandated last year, a minimal burden for most matches that are shot mostly by members. 2) Requirement for RSO/RO support by Club Members only – this will help to ensure consistent adherence to safety rules, especially when matches are beyond scope of Club rules.

Again, not a burden for most matches that use NRA certified RSOs, Match Directors can always contact me if need additional RSO support.

As always - when you are out enjoying your range, please do so safely. Always heed the red lights, and always be deliberate in your actions with firearms. If you ever have any questions, issues or concerns about safety at our range feel free to contact me.

- Speed Limit is 10mph or less.
- **1 target centered** on pistol & short rifle range targets.
- Shot size allowed on shotgun ranges is still 7 ½, 7 steel, 8, 9. Larger shot sizes (6, 4, 2, buckshot, & slugs are only allowed on Long Range
- pistol & short-range targets should be removed from shooting range and placed in target area after use.

General Meeting Minutes – September 5, 2023

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:01 p.m.
2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
3. Jeff is the proud recipient of the Springfield Hellcat 9 mm from our last raffle!
4. The Chief Range Safety Office reported that the first aid course is going well! We have another ten spots open for the next class on the 29th of September from 6-9 PM. We have had another case of too large a shot on the shotgun range patterning board. We must stick to the appropriately sized shot. Buck shot is too large. If we see a member heading down the wrong path, offer to help. Practical Pistol matches are suspended until further notice.
5. The Vice President Office reported, thank you for donating to the youth program! We've had a great turnout for our Youth Glock League. The Youth Glock League is held every 1st and 3rd Thursday of the month at 6:00.
6. The Member at Large reported that renewals are coming up, everything has been running smoothly. Memberships are good until December 31st. Renewals will be done online, there will be an in-person renewal for those that are not comfortable on a computer.
7. There are eight spaces remaining for Hunter Education. If you know someone who is interested, give them Ken Anderson's information.

8. Archery reported that on the field range, the first ten lanes now have permanent 3D targets. The first lane has a cougar, and the tenth lane has an elk. The range limit is 400 ft per second, and 600 grain arrows. Please take care and watch for real wildlife on the range!
9. Saturday there will be a military bolt actions match.
10. The meeting was adjourned at 7:17 p.m.

Officer Meeting Minutes – September 21, 2023

1. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.
2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
3. Specific issues and concerns regarding practical pistol matches were raised. USPSA safety rules are not being observed. It has been observed that the number of guests attending these events outnumber the number of members by around three to one. New shooter briefings are not being conducted, despite direction from the CRSO and subsequent direction of the Board. Those who have committed dangerous safety infractions have not been disqualified. The match has been left unattended and unsupervised at least twice. Gate codes need to be used and provided to guests for scheduled matches. The gate code can be tested before events to ensure that it is turned on. Matches need to be set up on the calendar with the Scheduler. The match director or delegates need to check the calendar to ensure that events are scheduled as planned and to be aware of any conflicting events. It was noted that online registration allows for event reminders and other helpful information to be sent out to participants. Signs noting the Long Range as 'match' are not being taken down, impacting other members' use of the range. Non-member participants have been observed using the range and other ranges before and/or after matches. Financial reporting has been insufficient. A stamp, a club card, and a receipt book were made available in preparation of transferring discipline funds to the club account. The first step to getting the practical pistol match back on the schedule will be for a discipline application to be submitted. An RO training seminar will be conducted prior to matches being placed on the schedule again. It will be the RO's responsibility and obligation to disqualify shooters when it is appropriate to do so.
4. TCGC Discipline Policy and associated documents were discussed. A draft copy of the TCGC Discipline Guidebook was reviewed and discussed. The TCGC Discipline Guidebook establishes the definition of a discipline (a group of likeminded shooters), what constitutes a discipline (two or more of the following met: payment to participate, non-members allowed to participate, special equipment required on the range, dedicated space for the activity, outside resource required), the elements of a discipline (approved by the board, has a discipline director, has a match/event coordinator other than the discipline director, has a safety officer other than the discipline director or match/event director, may have a committee, meets all reporting requirements), and the expectations of a discipline (schedule matches/events, provide match/event reports, provide regular financial reports, provide match/event safety reports, utilize waivers for all attendees of all matches/events regardless of participation). A draft copy of the TCGC Discipline Application Form was reviewed and discussed. The TCGC Discipline Application Form collects all of the information required for a discipline. The TCGC Discipline Match/Event Reporting document was shared and discussed. This document provides templates for typical reporting required of a discipline match or event. Final versions of each document will be issued this month.
5. One of the Norman FFA teachers' memberships was suspended. She is awaiting reinstatement. Another is awaiting a comp membership.
6. Hunter Education went well. There were 55 on the roster and 40 tested. Leftovers were donated.
7. We need assistance with recruiting for Camp & Shoot. A p-card was prepared for food costs. Waivers are already set up. A coordination meeting will be held on October 5th. Portable toilets have been requested.
8. Waivers will be needed for the upcoming FFA event. Portable toilets will be needed. Lunch will be needed for staff only.
9. Members desiring an upgrade must submit written correspondence. An email will be accepted as written correspondence.
10. It was recommended that the nominating committee be disbanded as nobody is stepping up.
11. Grants will get taken care of soon.

12. Renewals were discussed. An article regarding renewals needs to be prepared for the Hangfire. Something needs to be scheduled for the life members who need assistance. New members will be addressed.
13. Positive feedback on 25-yard berms on the long range.
14. A third first aid course is being done on the 29th of September.
15. Comp membership for ROTC staff was discussed. More information is necessary.
16. The 2024 budget needs to be discussed. Only youth and archery have been submitted. Some of our fixed costs are going up.
17. People are asking to join the club.
18. December and January general meetings are scheduled for Goldsby. 11/6/23 is a Monday. 12/5/23 and 1/9/24 are Tuesdays.
19. The meeting was adjourned at 9:17 p.m.

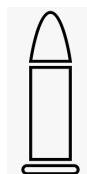
