<u>Guest Waivers</u>: A reminder that guest waivers must be completed once for each calendar year. Waivers are fully online; completion is quick and easy. Being able to bring guests with no charge is a great perk at our Club. For that, our responsibility is completion of waivers and maintaining control of our guests.

Safety Observations: As enter second term as your CRSO have been thinking about successes and areas for improvement. Success is built by many members who put safety first on all our ranges. One common observation stands out for improvement – when I or other RSOs must review rules with members or guests, often notice that other members shared the range but said nothing. So, a reminder that we all need to speak up if we see something, especially our RSOs. Call for cease fire, if necessary, provide constructive feedback about the observation, never aimed at the person. If you should ever receive feedback, think about the reason, and accept the feedback gracefully. If feedback results in conflict or "debate" about our Range Rules, I invite either Member to call, text or email.

No cars or trucks are allowed at sporting clays. If you have questions regarding sporting clays, please reach out to project leadership shotgun@tcqc.us.

Reminder: Sharing of the gate code with nonmembers is strictly prohibited. NO EXCEPTIONS!

Sign up for workday, projects, or event prep. Make friends while getting much needed chores and projects completed. Just let maintenance know if you have time or skills to contribute. Some skills needed are spraying (herbicides), carpentry, concrete, masonry, electrical, welding, and plumbing.

A few reminders to help keep your range awesome:

- Speed Limit is 10mph or less.
- 1 target centered on pistol & short rifle range targets.
- Shot size allowed on shotgun ranges (and pattern board) is 7 ½, 7 steel, 8, 9. Larger shot sizes (6, 4, 2, buckshot, & slugs are only allowed on Long Range
- pistol & short-range targets should be removed from shooting range and placed in target storage behind the chain after use.

- 1. The President, Scheduler, and Secretary were absent with previous notice.
- 2. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.
- 3. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
- 4. The Chief Range Safety Office reported the season's greetings! We are talking about starting up a Steel Challenge Competition. It is different from Practical Pistol. This could be a good program for the Youth. There is an article about it in the Hangfire. Looking back at my first term as CRSO, the most common thing I've seen is people watching things, and not reporting, or offering to help. We also need to encourage our younger members to become RSOs.
- 5. The Vice President Office reported that we have had a lot of kids out at Youth Night. We can use some extra hands to help with the Youth Shotgun on December 14th at 6:00 PM. We have had the FFA out shooting with us. We have had a lot of fun. We are raffling a Henry 44 mag. The profits will go towards the Youth Program. We would love to have your support. We will draw a winner when we sell 200 tickets. Friends of NRA are trying for a spring banquet. There will be a planning meeting tomorrow night at Interurban for anyone interested.
- 6. A member asked about renewals. It was advised that we are having technical difficulties, and we will let you know when you can renew. No one will lose their membership if it passes your renewal date. Please check your work hours before you renew.
- 7. The Treasurer Office reported that we have had some people doing construction at the range. It is not our construction; it is on the power poles. They have inflicted some damage, particularly to the gate. We do have a new gate coming in. We are working on getting the exit sensor in the appropriate place. We think they might be almost finished with the construction. There will also be work from the outside of the gate to the road. There is additional work being done on the Sporting Clay range. We own all the software, counters, and throwers, but still need to do the manual labor. The primary areas we have added are insurance, utilities, and Youth Programs. Historically the NRA has been the primary contributor of ammo. They are not handing out as many grants as usual. The Club is now funding the ammo.
- 8. The Member at Large reported that I have received a lot of emails about renewals, again, you will not lose your membership over our technical difficulties. We will let you know as soon as they open.

- 9. The vote was tabulated. Budget passed; Robert Powell was elected Member at Large.
- 10. Kevan Riley is looking for people interested in helping with the Scouts. It's lots of fun!!
- 11. Shotgun will now be shooting at 3:30 on Mondays instead of 5:30.
- 12. The meeting was adjourned at 7:41 p.m.




