Safety Report

I hope you had a great Thanksgiving and I wish you and yours the best for the coming Christmas Holidays.

Steel Challenge: I've been chatting with members and the Board about initiating Steel Challenge matches at our club. For those who are not aware, Steel Challenge matches are set up with stages picked from eight standard stages, each with five plates. The objective is to hit four plates in any order and to hit a stop plate last. Score is time with penalty for any misses. Visit SCSA.ORG for details, rules and an introduction video. It is a great way for experienced shooters to practice fundamentals, and is also a good introduction for anyone wanting to try practical shooting who may be intimidated by movement while shooting.

So why is your CRSO writing this, what does this have to do with safety on our ranges? I have been thinking it could serve as a safer style match, easier to officiate, start for members or guests. Also, watching our youth enjoy their recent preparation for a Glock match, made me think about more ways to expose our youth to competitive shooting.

Next steps? I'm seeking volunteers to form a Discipline Committee, please get in touch with me if interested.

Range Maintenance

When leaving the range, slow down when approaching the gate. The sensor has been moved away from the gate to give more time for opening. If gate does not open, pull up to the keypad and enter your code. Any issues with the gate operations need to be communicated to maintenance@tcgc.us or call Tara.

Reminder: Sharing of the gate code with non-members is strictly prohibited. NO EXCEPTIONS!

Sign up for workday, projects, or event prep. Make friends while getting much needed chores and projects completed. Just let maintenance know if you have time or skills to contribute. Some skills needed are spraying (herbicides), carpentry, concrete, masonry, electrical, and plumbing.

A few reminders to help keep your range awesome:

- Speed Limit is 10mph or less
- **1 target centered** on pistol & short rifle range targets
- Shot size allowed on shotgun ranges (and pattern board) is 7 ½, 7 steel, 8, 9. Larger shot sizes (6, 4, 2, buckshot, & slugs are only allowed on Long Range
- pistol & short-range targets should be removed from shooting range and placed in target area after use

General Meeting Minutes – November 6, 2023

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.
2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
3. Simm Rudnick brought an 1858 Springfield that was in 1902 configuration for show and tell.
4. The Chief Range Safety Office reported that he is thankful for RSOs. I have now done 2 safety orientations for new members. Please help the new members diplomatically when necessary. If you see something, say something. The Practical Pistol match is no longer suspended. We have had 2 matches.
5. The Vice President Office reported that we were really excited to have seven shooters at the Oklahoma Youth Glock Shoot. One of our shooters took the top place. Most of our youth shot 22, but a few shot 9 mm. We also have some of the local FFA groups coming out on youth nights. We are helping to train them on basics. We have a variety of kids that come out to youth night.
6. The Treasurer Office reported that we have had some issues with property damage. The sensors and mechanisms have been damaged, we are working to get them fixed. The ultimate goal is to make life easier for all the members. The board has told everyone that they need to renew by October, but the date you joined will be your renewal date. This will help keep us from many open memberships. I am working with the accountant to get our accounts to a single banking institution. The budget will be out shortly to the board and the finance committee. If you oversee an organization or board, please get your budgets to me as soon as possible. We aren't getting as many ammunition grants as we are used to, the club is having to fund some of these.
7. The Scheduler reported that the gate will be replaced soon. The designer came out to take measurements. 5-stand has been going strong for Saturday. All the major events happen on Saturdays, if we need to reschedule, we can.
8. The Member at Large reported that I have been getting a lot of questions about people wanting to join and wanting to renew. You have until December 31st. If you have already tried to renew, you will get a letter from the secretary. As far as renewals go, we will keep you updated. All guest waivers are now digital. If you bring a guest, you can scan the QR code. If they don't have the tech there is a tablet in the Stat House, they can fill out the form there.
9. The President reported that There is going to be a vote coming up in December. If you would like to run for a board position, this is the last chance to join.
10. Charles Kliwer is running for member-at-large. He has been a member since 2017. He likes shotgun. Charles is a retired farmer and rancher from around Canton Lake. After his farm dissolved, he and his wife moved down here to be closer to his daughters. Being a self-employed farmer, he is used to

watching income and expenses. He served 6 years in the army national guard. After moving to the city, he worked for ODOC. He is proud to say that he and the inspectors can account for every piece of material and budget for the projects. He has leadership experience and looks forward to serving as the member-at-large if elected. Mike Whittaker has known Charles for years and supports him.

11. Ken Anderson thanks the club for all the volunteers at all the events to support the youth at the events the club puts on.
12. The meeting was adjourned at 7:35 p.m.

Officer Meeting Minutes – November 16, 2023

1. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.
2. The previous meeting minutes were approved.
3. There was a brief discussion regarding Scouting events.
4. Grant proposals are in progress and due December 15th.
5. A concern was raised regarding retention of data. Data retention questions should be directed to the board.
6. Memberships will remain in effect until the member is notified that renewal is required *and*, in the case that the member does not opt to renew, the renewal date has passed.
7. Resolving damages to range infrastructure during a recent event and by B&H was discussed. An itemized list of is to be repaired needs to be produced and a timeline for resolution needs to be determined.
8. A member raised the concern that other clubs charge sales tax, but TCGC does not and maybe it should. The club accountant has been contacted to provide guidance.
9. Appropriate tax forms have been filed to ensure that the club retains its current non-profit status.
10. The proposed 2024 TCGC Budget was provided, reviewed, and discussed. Several line items have been increased, including insurance, youth events, and utilities. Costs are increasing with the market and with a reduction of NRA support. Archery improvement elements and Sporting Clays will be rolled into the range improvement fund as line items of that fund. This includes various projects that were previously approved as separate items. Range improvements were differentiated from range maintenance. Range improvements denote new or substantially upgraded items. Range maintenance includes upkeep of current equipment, infrastructure, and other assets.
11. The Quickbooks software is having some issues. Professional software assistance has been requested. No funds have been lost or misplaced.
12. Promotion to life membership was discussed.
13. It was clarified that, regarding the new berms on the long range, new targets will not be placed prior to the new berms being placed.
14. Repairs to the gate are being planned. There is not an ETA for installation yet.
15. An after-action review was conducted following Boy Scout Camp & Shoot. Everything found applies to Sportsfest as well. Minimally two adults will be required for each group. An orientation meeting will be held for adult group leaders. It will be requested to identify participants with disabilities that may require additional accommodation and/or supervision, and that an adult known to the participant be an adult leader of that participant's group. Various equipment needs were identified and will be submitted to the board at a later date.
16. Hosting Steel Challenge matches at TCGC was discussed. A Steel Challenge match comprises at least three stages selected from eight standard stages, each with 5 plates of different shapes and sizes, one being the stop plate. Rules and procedures are similar to USPSA, details at scsa.org. The object is to accurately shoot steel as fast as you can. This is a great introduction to practical shooting and could be used as part of club youth programs.
All eight stages would cost approximately \$5,700, which is the most cost-effective purchase option. A moveable trailer, preferably enclosed, would be necessary. The budget can accommodate the required materials and the trailer. The board was generally positive toward the idea, with no objections.
17. A member raised a concern regarding the timing of renewals and the associated cost due to not collecting new member dues. It was noted that the club has large numbers of regular memberships open. Filling these regular memberships will open associate memberships.
18. The meeting was adjourned at 7:38 p.m.
